Responsibilities and Essential Duties and Functions (not exhaustive of all responsibilities):

- Preparation of recommended budget for motor pool activities to the Director of Public Services annually, or as needed.
- Work with Director of Public Services to make recommendations for equipment updates and replacement.
- Requisition parts, tools, and materials, maintain repair records and prepare reports of work completed.
- Maintain adequate records as assigned of parts, maintenance procedures, etc.
- Arrange for vehicle "recalls" with appropriate facilities.
- Determine cause of malfunctions and perform repair work on gasoline and light/heavy duty diesel equipment, and special automotive and other vehicles including trucks, tractors, sweepers, graders, power driven tools and generators.
- Adjust, repair, and replace parts in engines, transmissions, differentials, and other equipment.
- Make repairs to the electrical systems of automotive and other power-driven equipment.
- Perform road service on equipment when needed.
- Rebuild and adjust brakes and make repairs to hydraulic system.
- Perform motor tune-ups on all types of equipment and all routine preventative maintenance.
- Balance wheel, change and repair tires and replace shock absorbers.
- Lubricate and inspect equipment according to preventative maintenance schedules.
- Perform minor body and frame repair work involving welding, brazing, soldering, and cutting operations.
- Clean and maintain garage and other public works facilities.
- Position subject to emergency call in.
- Other duties as assigned.
